



INSTRUCTION FOR AUTHOR(S)



Submission Criteria

- Manuscripts must be written in good English.
- Manuscripts should be submitted by one of the authors of the manuscript through the online Manuscript Tracking System.
- Regardless of the source of the word-processing tool, only Word (.doc, .docx, .rtf) files can be submitted through the OJS.
- Manuscripts must be original and within the scope of the Journal.
- All manuscripts should be prepared using the Journal's templates and have the correct style before being considered for review.
- Using these templates, original research and review articles should not typically be more than 15 manuscript pages.
- Only online submissions are accepted to facilitate rapid publication and minimize administrative costs.
- Manuscripts must be approved by two or more reputed referees specialized in the respective field.
- Submissions by anyone other than one of the authors will not be accepted.
- The submitting author takes responsibility for the paper during submission and peer review.
- If for some technical reason submission through the OJS is not possible, the author can contact adejou@qu.edu.iq for support.

OJS Manuscripts

This journal uses OJS Manuscripts to peer review manuscript submissions. Please read the guide for OJS authors before making a submission. Complete guidelines for preparing and submitting your manuscript to this journal are provided below

Formatting and templates

Papers may be submitted in any standard file of Word format, . Figures should be saved separately from the text. The main document should be double-spaced, with one-inch margins on all sides, and all pages should be numbered consecutively. Text should appear in 12-point Times New Roman or other common 12-point font.

Normally manuscripts are expected not to exceed 25 double-spaced pages including text, tables, figures and Bibliography.

Terms of Submission

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Title and Authorship Information

The following information should be included

Paper title

Full author names

Full institutional mailing addresses

Email addresses

Abstract

The manuscript should contain an abstract. The abstract should be self-contained and citation-free and should not exceed 200 words.

Introduction

This section should be succinct, with no subheadings.

Materials and Methods

This part should contain sufficient detail so that all procedures can be repeated. It can be divided into subsections if several methods are described.

Results and Discussion

This section may each be divided by subheadings or may be combined.

Conclusions

This should clearly explain the main conclusions of the work highlighting its importance and relevance.

Acknowledgments

All acknowledgments (if any) should be included at the very end of the paper before the references and may include supporting grants, presentations, and so forth.

References

Authors are responsible for ensuring that the information in each reference is complete and accurate. All references must be numbered consecutively and citations of references in text should be identified using numbers in square brackets (e.g., “as discussed by Smith [9]”; “as discussed elsewhere [9, 10]”). All references should be cited within the text; otherwise, these references will be automatically removed.
